Five actors share the combined stories of daily life of these people, affected in different ways by operational stress injuries and post-traumatic stress disorder. It was very powerful.

Visit to the Senate

The train trip was the perfect time to focus on strategic matters and plan for the new year. It's amazing how much can get accomplished in 5 hours... and that was just on the way there!






Visiting the Pepper Pod


